About Art In The Loop

2023 is the tenth year anniversary of the Art in the Loop Project, a curated outdoor exhibition of temporary artworks and performances presented in partnership with the KC Streetcar Authority. Artists responded to the 2023 theme of "Celebrate" and addressed questions about how and what we celebrate in our lives is reflected in the artwork, the art practice, our community, and our city.

In 2023 we celebrated 10 years of producing the Art in the Loop Project, our annual art exhibition and performance series held on the KC Streetcar route and other Downtown locations featuring local artists! During this time, we have distributed 215 artist stipends, held 162 performances and installed 98 artworks! New in 2023 was a serial live painting project by Bubble Gum Kurt, free yoga classes at the Union Station Streetcar Stop organized by Kyneesha Edwards in support of her artwork "Black Boy Joy" and the community installation of a Flower Garden by Madeline Marak at the River Market West Stop. We had engaging performances including contemporary dance, aerial performers, and music styles across the board! I am proud of the diversity of the programming and our reach; but most importantly, I treasure the opportunity to work with each of the individual artists - their creativity never fails to blow me away! I am also grateful for the leadership of our two artistic directors, Jade Osborne and Marissa Starke, our partnership with KC Streetcar and Donna Mandelbaum as well as the entire Art in the Loop Board of directors.


"My career has benefited greatly by my participation in Art in the Loop. The impact on my practice as an artist is immense. It has pushed me to think differently and meet unexpected challenges. The streetcar have given me an incredible way to present my work to the public unlike anything I've experienced before. To have my art moving through space and surprising people with a sudden appearance is a fantastic experience. I think it is possible that more people may have interacted with my work through Art in the Loop than in my nearly 20 year career as an artist.

The response on social media and in daily life has been highly rewarding and given me validation that artists seldom receive. The positive feedback from the community has been very nurturing. It has given me concrete acknowledgment as a member of the Kansas City art community. As I have come to art by a non-traditional route this is particularly meaningful.

Because of the streetcar I have made connections with people whom I might not have ever met and I see this resulting in future collaborations."

"The location of here, with you is meaningful to me because my parents used to be weekend vendors at City Market in the 80s. Having my work displayed at a stop overlooking the market felt like a full-circle moment. When I saw the piece for the first time, I was emotional. I imagined them in this space, but now with their descendants watching over them from the future.

The act of making this work and having it be a collaborative process with my children is what is at the core of this image.



When this image was installed at River Market North, the meaning of the work changed. Witnessing people interacting with this now life-sized image of me and my daughter created new layers of meaning.

I show my work in gallery spaces but I've always preferred having it displayed in public places. It's important for art to be accessible to all communities and for the art to reflect the experiences of members of those communities."











Madeline Marak *Flower Garden* | River Market West

"Flower Garden is a playful, layered installation of colorful acrylic flowers that celebrates creativity and community collaboration. The shapes of the flowers are derived from digital scans of kids' drawings created at a community art studio in Kansas City. The piece evolved and grew as time went on starting with the base leaf layer, then the reflective shapes, and finally the bright flowers. The public was invited to install the flowers during a lively public event. It was a great experience interacting with the public and hearing their reactions to the creative process. The best part was seeing all the different ways people approached creativity.

My goal was to create a piece that celebrated and shared the joy I get from being an artist. I hope the piece reminds someone of a time they were creative and inspires them to be creative. This experience has enriched my art practice immensely. Watching the piece take on a life of its own as it spins in the wind or is lit up by streetlights exemplifies the magic of placing art outside for all to see. People have told me the piece is part of their morning commute, others have said they made a family outing specifically to see my art while eating ice cream. I love that I could be a part of a small moment in someone's life."

"My artistic and professional growth has improved greatly since becoming a selected artist for Art in the Loop. I moved to Kansas City from Houston in July of 2022.

My time working with Art in the Loop has been a wonderful experience. Creating a public mural has brought eyes to me as a professional artist while also challenging my work and pushing me out of my normal creative process.







My piece was unusual from other applicants, so having it approved, then collaborating with members of Art in the Loop to bring my hand painted directly to a street car shelter has been a meaningful step in my career as a creative. I have grown confident in my capabilities because for this project I researched, planned, and tested, only to encounter issues with my materials on the day of the first painting session. My preparation, plus my skills I had built up as an artist helped me complete a beautiful, unique, and colorful piece of art to be celebrated and one that I am proud of.

"I felt it was important to respond to the prompt of celebration with something that would shed light on the Black experience and uplift my culture. As a result, I realized the power that art has to build community, and that as a creative, I have the ability to tap into that power through my work.

Black Boy Joy started as a celebration of Black men and boys claiming joy in ways that feel authentic to them. It grew into a community movement complete with a 4-part yoga series, additional philanthropic donations, and an array of merchandise to keep the celebration going. As the project gained more coverage and admiration from the community, I was blessed with opportunities to share my mission and vision with local organizations, journalists and various community members. This project reminded me that I have important things to say through my work. I remembered that it's my responsibility to continue using my art as a vehicle to bring awareness to issues that deserve to have an increased following. I'm thankful for Art in the Loop for providing the vehicle to be able to do so."

"As musical artists that typically play in traditional rock venues, playing in a non-traditional space like the library allowed us to express our music in a different way. The acoustics in the space brought out the orchestral sound of the cello and bassoon. It was a unique experience to perform with other artforms other than music.

We were able to connect and share our music with people who may not typically be exposed to classical instruments in such a unique style. We were excited to have an audience that was attentive and captivated by our work. Underground Homies

"Underground Homies features artists Steddy P (born and raised in KC) and GIPSON (a 5-year transplant) who focus on being "Made in KC" as people. It will occur at the City Market 816 Day celebration. Having artists from both sides of the KC experiences, audiences will engage with two stories that share a similar vein- thankfulness for the city and the shaping it has brought. These two artists also have different styles of music which will help create a narrative that highlights the diaspora of sound and culture the city has."




